INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

Carmignac China New Economy is an equity fund looking to seize investment opportunities arising mainly, but not exclusively, from China's New Economy. The latter offers numerous sustainable growth themes in areas such as healthcare, education, clean energy, technological innovation and "sustainable" consumption, including e-commerce and Internet which benefit from the increasing purchasing power and improving living standards of Chinese households. Stock selection is the Fund's main performance driver and is based on rigorous financial and extra-financial analysis. Its objective is to outperform its reference indicator over at least 5 years. The Fund also looks to minimise its environmental impact by reducing its carbon footprint by 5% annually.








GEOGRAPHIC BREAKDOWN





FUND MANAGEMENT ANALYSIS





- In China markets showed mixed performances in November.
- Hong Kong markets (H shares) declined due to concerns over Trump's protectionist measures, while domestic markets (A shares) rose, supported by encouraging macroeconomic data (Caixin Manufacturing PMI at 51.5 and retail sales up 4.8%) and speculation about potential new support measures from the Chinese government at the Central Economic Work Conference in December.
- The incoming Trump administration plans to impose tariffs of 25% on all imports from Mexico and Canada, along with additional tariffs of 10% on imports from China. These measures are currently viewed more as negotiating tactics rather than definitive policies.
- The third quarter result season ended with no surprises. with Tencent, Alibaba, and JD meeting expectations.



PERFORMANCE COMMENTARY

- Against this backdrop, the fund delivered a negative performance, underperforming its reference indicator.
- Our positions in the consumer discretionary sector, particularly in Pinduoduo, the parent company of Temu, negatively impacted us as their Q2 results fell short of forecasts, leading to a decline in the stock market. Additionally, we were affected by our holdings in Yadea and Tal Education.
- We also faced challenges with EHang, which, despite announcing a \$30 million equity redemption, reported third-quarter results below expectations, disappointing investors.
- Nevertheless, we benefited somewhat from our diversification into Taiwanese technology stocks, with Elite Materials and Lotes rising.



OUTLOOK AND INVESTMENT STRATEGY

- Although in the long term we remain constructive on the Chinese markets, in the short term we are maintaining a cautious stance due to the nomination of Donald Trump as President of the United States and future stimulus announcements by the Chinese government.
- Donald Trump's protectionist policies, with tariffs on imports, mainly from China, and expectations of the Central Economic Work Conference in December and the annual 'Two Sessions' meeting in March, are keeping uncertainty high.
- We are closely monitoring each of our Chinese positions and their valuation, with the aim of remaining disciplined in calibrating our positions. We have taken profits on some of our Chinese positions, which have rebounded strongly in recent days, and for which the valuation argument has become less attractive.
- Over the month, we added Lite-On, a Taiwanese company specialising in the production of equipments for the semiconductor industry, to our portfolio.






MSCI ESG SCORE PORTFOLIO VS REFERENCE INDICATOR (%)

GLOSSARY

Active Management: An investment management approach where a manager aims to beat the market through research, analysis and their own judgement.

Active share: Portfolio active share measures how different from the reference indicator the portfolio is. The closer the active share is to 100%, the less identical stocks a portfolio has compared to its reference indicator, thus the more active the portfolio manager is compared to the market.

Alpha: Alpha measures the performance of a portfolio compared to its reference indicator. Negative alpha means the fund performed less well than its reference indicator (e.g. if the indicator increased by 10% in one year and the fund increased by only 6%, its alpha is -4). Positive alpha means the fund performed better than its reference indicator (e.g. if the indicator increased by 6% in one year and the fund increased by 10%, its alpha is 4).

Beta: Beta measures the relationship between the fluctuations of the net asset values of the fund and the fluctuations of the levels of its reference indicator. Beta of less than 1 indicates that the fund "cushions" the fluctuations of its index (beta = 0.6 means that the fund increases by 6% if the index increases by 10% and decreases by 6% if the index falls by 10%). Beta higher than 1 indicates that the fund "magnifies" the fluctuations of its reference indicator (beta = 1.4 means that the fund increases by 14% when the index increases by 10% but also decreases by 14% when the index decreases by 10%). Beta of less than 0 indicates that the fund reacts inversely to the fluctuations of its reference indicator (beta = -0.6 means that the fund falls by 6% when the index increases by 10% and vice

Capitalisation: A company's stock market value at any given moment. It is obtained by multiplying the number of shares of a company by its stock exchange

FCP: Fonds commun de placement (French common fund).

Investment/net exposure rate: The investment rate constitutes the volume of assets invested expressed as a percentage of the portfolio. Adding the impact of the derivatives to this investment rate results in the net exposure rate, which corresponds to the real percentage of asset exposure to a certain risk. Derivatives can be used to increase the underlying asset's exposure (stimulation) or reduce it (hedging).

Net asset value: Price of all units (in an FCP) or shares (in a SICAV)

Sharpe ratio: The Sharpe ratio measures the excess return over the risk-free rate divided by the standard deviation of this return. It thus shows the marginal return per unit of risk. When it is positive, the higher the Sharpe ratio, the more risk-taking is rewarded. A negative Sharpe ratio does not necessarily mean that the portfolio posted a negative performance, but rather that it performed worse than a risk-free investment.

Volatility: Range of price variation of a security, fund, market or index, which enables the measurement of risk over a given period. It is determined using the standard deviation obtained by calculating the square root of the variance. The variance is obtained by calculating the average deviation from the mean, which is then squared. The greater the volatility, the greater the risk.

ESG: E for Environment, S for Social, G for Governance

ESG score Calculation: Only the Equity and Corporate Bond holdings of the fund considered. The model has three distinct modules, production model (used for power-generating utilities), company-specific intensity model (used for companies that have reported carbon emissions data in the past but not for all years), & industry segment-specific intensity model (used for companies that have not reported any carbon emissions data in the past).
